Kanesatake Health Center – Statement on Bill 2

The Kanesatake Health Center (KHC) advises the community that its leadership and Board of Directors stand firmly in support of the visiting physicians who provide care at KHC and are being directly affected by the Quebec government's Bill 2. This legislation, introduced without meaningful consultation, imposes significant changes to physician compensation and performance requirements that do not reflect the realities of Kanehsatà:ke or other Indigenous communities.

By prioritizing patient volume over the quality and continuity of care, Bill 2 risks reducing the availability and consistency of visiting medical services and undermining essential health supports. Such measures are unacceptable and threaten the well-being of Kanehsatà:ke.

KHC is working with its visiting medical professionals and exploring collaborative approaches with partners to identify ways to mitigate the local impacts of this legislation. Our focus is on ensuring continuity of essential services for the community despite the uncertainty created by Bill 2.

The Kanehsatà:ke Health Center will continue to oppose any policy that compromises access to care, undermines local autonomy, or harms the stability of services on which our community depends. Our priority remains the health, safety, and dignity of our people.
